Changing Times

The Industrial Revolution changed the economic and social face of America in the late 1700s. This was a time when the **ingenuity** of men like Eli Whitney and Samuel Slater helped to develop new ways of organizing work, mostly based on science and technological advances.

Before this time, goods like clothing were manufactured by hand at home. Making yarn for a new shirt was a long process that wasn't quick, and it wasn't easy. However, Slater's invention of a new spinning machine changed all that.

Soon, skilled craftsmen and **artisans** were no longer needed. Unskilled workers could now do the work instead. This meant that more products could be produced in less time, and the price of goods was much more affordable.
