About the Author



Art Spiegelman (b. 1948) is an American author and illustrator whose Holocaust narratives—Maus (1986) and Maus II (1991)—helped to establish the graphic novel as a sophisticated literary form. Maus was serialized from 1980 to 1991, and it depicts Spiegelman interviewing his father about his experiences as a Polish Jew and Holocaust survivor.


Media Vocabulary

The following words will be useful to you as you analyze, discuss, and write about graphic novels.


panel: individual frame of a graphic novel depicting a single moment	 The panels work together to tell a story. The panels cannot show everything that happens, so readers must use their imaginations to fill in the blanks.
encapsulation: choice of which scenes to capture, or display, in panels	 The layout and choice of the scenes drives the readers' interpretations. Graphic novelists can use different sizes and shapes to give more or less weight to scenes.
speech balloon: display of what a character is speaking or thinking	 The size, shape, and color of the speech balloon can show the emotion of the speaker. Speech balloons can also show emotion through the use of punctuation marks and musical symbols.

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BACKGROUND

In *Maus*, Art Spiegelman tells the story of his parents, Vladek and Anja Spiegelman, who survived the Holocaust. At the start of this excerpt, Vladek and Anja are living in hiding with Mrs. Motonowa, whose husband does not know she is hiding Jews. They arrange a meeting with smugglers at the house of a woman named Mrs. Kawka to discuss plans to be smuggled out of Poland.


