Most all of WRHS students need this extra support. Our 10th-12th grade students were blindsided with Covid-19 last school year and did not get all their credits they should have.

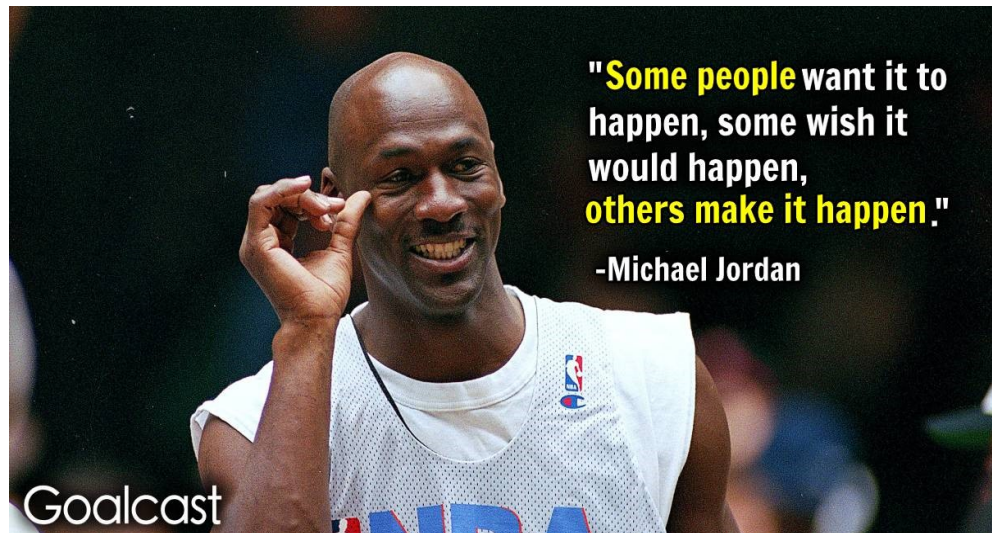
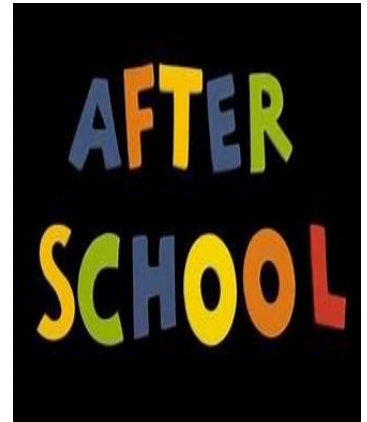
Students must have 22 credits to graduate. There are certain core credits and additional parameters that students must meet in order to graduate with

Saturday Academy

WRHS Saturday Academy is up and running. This academic support program is sponsored by GEAR UP. Mrs. O'Gleason our GEAR UP coordinator is actively recruiting students to attend and make-up credits. Sophomores are the focus for Saturday Academy, but all students are welcome. We have a Math teacher, Mrs. Amihan and an English teacher, Mrs. Sagario who are at the Saturday program to help support students

in getting their credits recovered.

Saturday Academy begins at 8:30 am and runs until 12:30 pm.

Students will enter C-wing and check in with the teachers.

Covid Procedures

In regards to procedures; we do practice implementation of State and Federal guidance for Covid19. This ranges from temperature checks to monitoring of student symptoms. If a student tests positive...there is a flowchart that is followed for contact tracing and notification to contacts of possible exposure.

At WRHS we do practice CDC guidelines for grade appropriate capacity. We advocate for all students and staff to wear masks, use hand sanitizer/wash with soap and water and practice social distancing where appropriate.

According to the CDC:

Physical Distancing

Because of the importance of in-person learning, schools where not everyone is fully vaccinated should implement physical distancing to the extent possible within their structures but should not exclude stu-

dents from in-person learning to keep a minimum distance requirement.

We appreciate your concern for your students and will work to ensure as safe a learning environment as possible.



Tardy Policy

Being to class on time is a simple and basic expectation of all school environments. For our school to achieve exemplary student performance, all students are expected to be in class on time. "On time" means being inside the classroom at the end of the tardy bell; this includes first hour class. This school year; students who are not in class when the tardy bell rings will be on a 3 level system.

Level 1

Warning/Cautionary Level

If a student is tardy 3 or more times during the school week they will be in violation of this policy. Student will be given a warning; a notice will be given to parent either through phone, e-mail or letter sent home with student.

Level 2

Notification Level

If a student is tardy 3 or more times during the school week they will be in violation of this policy. Lunch detention and student will be given notifica-

tion that further violations will result in overnight suspension. a notice will be given to parent either through phone, e-mail or letter sent home with student.

Level 3

Discipline Level

If a student is tardy 3 or more times during the school week they will be in violation of this policy. Student will be given overnight suspension until **PARENT CONFERENCE**.

Once a student is in Level 3/Discipline Level, they will remain in that status until the end of the semester.

Being Tardy applies to students and their 1st hour class. So, please be on time in the morning.

Arizona Online Instruction

Moving to online learning or hybrid learning, is not a viable option for the WRUSD and WRHS at this time.

- Last year; Gov. Ducey temporarily waived the parameters for A.O.I. (Arizona Online Instruction). He will not waive the certification this school year.
- In order for schools to use online learning, they must have a certification. WRUSD does not have an A.O. I certification

HOMEWORK:

Students get sick at the beginning of the school year every year. With concern and caution about the Covid virus, parents are choosing to keep students home. We understand. Students can get their homework from their teachers when they return or contact teachers through e-mail. We will not be requesting homework assignments from the front office this school year.
